BARGAINING UPDATES

The Canadian Air Navigation Specialists Association (CANSA) at Unifor Local 1016 have voted 95% in favour of authorizing a strike, should negotiations with NAV Canada fail to reach an agreement over key issues of wages and concessions. READ MORE

Unifor has reached a tentative agreement with Loblaw-owned Dominion grocery stores in Newfoundland and Labrador. READ MORE Unifor Local 144 members at Griffin Wheel have ratified a new four-year contract, ending a 19-day lockout. READ MORE

Unifor members employed by Expertech, a wholly owned subsidiary of Bell Canada Enterprises Inc., expressed overwhelming support for a strike mandate.

Unifor members at the Courtyard by Marriott and the W Toronto hotel have voted overwhelmingly to strike if a new collective agreement cannot be reached next month. READ MORE
